1- National Democratic Alliance (NDA) a national coalition headed by the BJP-1998-2014 and 2015-2019

2- Untied Progressive Alliance (UPA) A national level coalition headed by INC (Indian National Congress.)

Q-3 Distinguished among General , Mid term and by- elections

Ans- General Election- these are held after the expiry of the regular term of the Lok sabha or state Legislative Assembly. They are held at regular intervals of five years.

Mid-term Election- They are held as a consequence of the dissolution of lok sabha or State Legislative Assembly before the expiry of its term of five year.

By- Elections- If a representative dies before the completion of his tenure or the seat is vacant due to other reason.
